



EcoVadis' overview of the sustainability performance of EU companies




- 150,000+ companies globally rated by EcoVadis since 2007
- 53,600 companies globally rated in 2024
- 26,400 EU companies rated in 2024 including:
 - 9% large companies (1,000+ employees)
 - 91% of small and medium companies (under 1,000 employees)

On average, large EU companies have more advanced reporting practices than their non-EU counterparts

On average, large EU companies have more advanced reporting practices than their non-EU counterparts




- Large EU companies are more likely than large non-EU companies to already have their sustainability reporting 3rd party audited
- Large EU companies are more likely than large non-EU companies to define and disclose a materiality assessment



National differences in reporting practices on labor & human rights issues







